Calicut University Four Year Undergraduate Programme (CUFYUGP)

FYUGP or the Four-Year Undergraduate programme, is a new curriculum introduced by the University Grants Commission (UGC) of India. The goal of FYUGP is to provide undergraduate students with a more holistic and flexible education.

The key features are:

1. **Four-year duration:** The programme extends the traditional three-year undergraduate degree to four years, allowing for a more comprehensive learning experience.
2. **Multiple exit options:** Students can exit with a bachelor's degree after three years or an honours/ research degree after four years.
3. **Flexible curriculum:** The curriculum is designed to be interdisciplinary, allowing students to explore a range of subjects beyond their core area of study.
4. **Skill development:** in addition to academic coursework, FYUGP emphasizes the development of practical skills and hands-on learning through internships, project- based work, and community engagement.
5. **The Four-Year Degree is compatible with the**

international standards and thus provides opportunities to students to pursue their higher studies outside the country without losing a year. The new system also provides the facility of transfer in-between the course duration to other colleges/ universities or even interstate transfer is possible.

6. Those who have completed a four-year honours UG need to study only one year for the Post graduate programme in their subject and can appear for the NET exam.
7. Students with a 75% mark (or cumulative CGPA 7.5) in the first six semesters only are eligible to continue for the Honours with Research in the fourth year. (5% mark or 0.5 in CGPA will be exempted for reservation category students). Those students completing Honours with Research can pursue research in their specialised subject
8. There is provision to complete the degree in two and a half years and degree with honours in three and a half years.

The implementation of FYUGP is expected to enhance the quality of higher education in India, fostering critical thinking, creativity, and adaptability among the undergraduate students.

Choice Based Credit Semester System (CBCSS) for Under Graduate Curriculum

A) Programme Structure

Students are admitted to undergraduate programmes. The duration of an undergraduate programme will be 6 semesters in a period of 3 academic years. The odd semester will be from June to October and even semester from November to March. Each semester will have a minimum of 90 working days inclusive of all examinations. Each programme has the following courses.

1. Common Courses
2. Core Courses
3. Complementary Courses
4. Open Courses
5. Elective Courses

Every student has to undergo 10 common courses. Core courses are the major (Core) subject of the degree programme chosen by the student. Core courses are offered by the parent department. The numbers of core courses vary from 10 to 18 including a project work. Complementary courses cover the one or two disciplines that are related to the core subject and are distributed in the first four semesters. There will be one open course in core subjects in the fifth semester. Open course will

be open to all students of the institution except for the students of parent department. The student can opt one subject offered by any other department of the institution. Each department can decide the open courses from a pool of three courses offered by the University.

Each department will also select one course as Elective from the courses offered by the Board of Studies of the particular discipline.

B) Exams

There will be University examinations at the end of each semester conducted by the University and two internal examinations conducted by the college. Mark scored by the student in the internal examinations will be one of the criteria for continuous assessment. Question paper may contain short answer, paragraph and essay type questions similar to University question paper pattern. Project examination will be conducted at the end of final semester.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Fifty Percentage of the Admission to the U.G & P.G programmes of self-financing colleges 2024-25 will be conducted through the Centralized Ranking Process of the University of Calicut. The remaining 50% admission will be conducted by the college under Management quota. Candidates have to apply directly to the college for admission under the Management Quota through the college website www.peakaycicscollege.in by remitting a fee of Rs. 300. For Centralized Ranking Process (CRP) candidates shall apply on line through www.cuonline.ac.in. Candidates have to upload their photo, personal and educational data to the online application on the CRP website after submitting the fee of Rs. 470/- for general candidates and Rs. 195/- for SC/ST.

The university will process the online CRP applications and the rank list as per the admission rules of University. Candidate who seeks admission under management quota should also apply online. For more details, please see the University website www.cuonline.ac.in

RULES AND CODE OF CONDUCT

1. Promotion to higher class, selection for University examination and issue of progress report, attendance or conduct certificate are matters absolutely within the discretion of the Principal

2. Students shall always maintain utmost decency in their interaction with fellow students. Any instance of harassment will be viewed very seriously and will invite stringent punishment.
3. Mobile phones and other electronic equipment should only be used with the permission of the teacher concerned.
4. The furniture in a class room or any other place should not be shifted to other place without the permission of the HOD.
5. After the class is over, no student is permitted to remain in the college or college premises without the permission from authorities. If a free hour comes during the working time, the students should utilize the free time fruitfully either in their own class room or in the library.
6. Loitering in the verandas, gathering in front of the classes, corridors, portico etc. are detrimental to the smooth functioning of the college and should be avoided.
7. Organizational activities of students: As per the judgment of the Honourable High Court of Kerala, the Principal has right to control the organizational activities of student organizations on the campus.
8. The walls, class rooms and premises of the college should be kept clean and tidy. The college properties should not be damaged/disfigured.
9. Using crackers or explosives within 100 metres of the campus is strictly prohibited by the honourable High

Court of Kerala. It shall be considered as a criminal offence.

10. Healthy relation, true friendship and peaceful co-existence are expected in any term of co-education. Students should desist from undesirable relations and indecent behaviour.
11. Students are expected to come in decent dress code.
12. Ragging is an inhuman and cruel activity. It is condemnable from moral perspective also. Ragging means doing of any act by disorderly conduct to a student which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or shame or embarrassment to the student and includes:
 - * Teasing or abusing or playing practical joke on or causing harm to such student
 - * Asking a student to do any act or performance which generally an individual would not be willing to do.
13. Any act, in any form, against a new entrant of the college will be treated as Ragging and the accused will be made liable for punishment as per the Indian Penal Code. Ragging in any form is a non-bailable offence and requires criminal procedure. If any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, severe action will be taken against such student if they fail to give satisfactory explanation and the matter will be forwarded to the police for further action under criminal procedure. They will be forbidden from pursuing their studies in any other institution for five

years.

14. Students are warned that in case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he shall be expelled from the college.
15. Each student of the college and his/her parent should submit an under taking in the prescribed form at the time of registration.
16. Late coming or leaving the class early shall result in loss of half day attendance.
17. The minimum requirement of attendance during a semester shall be 75% for each course.
18. Students whose attendance falls below the minimum shall apply for condonation to the University through the Principal with chalan as per University rules.
19. If a student is absent for one or more hours in the forenoon session or in the afternoon session, it will be treated as absence for half a day. If he is absent for one or more hours in each session, it will be treated as absence for one full day.
20. Fee will be received at the office counter on stipulated dates during office working hours.
21. Students will be given receipt from the office for any payment for future reference.
22. If the fees with fine are not paid within the time limit, the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the college. However, such students can be readmitted

by remitting all dues and with special permission from the Principal.

23. When the due date for any payment happens to be a holiday, the next working day will be treated as due date.
24. Fee once collected will not be refunded.
25. Students should not involve in any activity which will affect the normal functioning of the college.
26. Students must wear their ID while on the college campus.
27. Students using college bus must remit the fee at the beginning of each month.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The College Library has a collection of more than 3500 books, and subscribes to 22 periodicals. The library has computerized its operations and services with the library management software. The library offers online public access catalogue (OPAC), a computerized catalogue with bar codes which helps in issuing the books quickly. It is well organized with a wide range of books catering to the need of students and teachers.

Library Rules

The Library Advisory committee consists of the Principal, HODs, staff and student representatives to advise the librarian on all matters relating to the library.

1. Working hours: 08.30 a.m. to 03.00 p.m. (Monday to Saturday)

2. All students of the college are members of the library.
3. They are entitled to borrow books on production of borrower's cards which can be collected from the college Library.
4. Loss of cards must be reported immediately to the college Librarian. Duplicate borrower's card will be issued after a specific period at the discretion of the Librarian. A fine of Rs.10/- will be levied for each card loss.
5. Books shall be issued/ or returned to the library with the time period and in the manner notified by the library from time to time.
6. No member shall keep a book for more than a fortnight. A book may be re-issued to the same student if there is no other applicant for it.
7. Absence from the college will not be considered as an excuse for delay in returning books.
8. The Librarian may recall a book at any time even when the normal period of loan is not over.
9. Members shall not sub lend the books issued to them.
10. On no account shall a member disfigure a library book. When a member receives a book from the library, he/ she must confirm that the book is in sound condition. If it is not, the matter should be brought to the notice of the librarian, failing which the member shall be liable to replace the book with a new copy.
11. Members shall replace a book lost or pay its price fixed by the Principal.
12. If the date on which a book is due to be returned falls on a holiday, it shall be returned the next working day.

13. All members of the teaching staff of the college are members of the library. A member of the staff may borrow upto seven/ten books at a time. The rule of returning books in a fortnight does not ordinarily apply to them in the matter of subject books. But in the case of general books and books on other subjects, they shall not keep a book for more than a fortnight. A member of non-teaching staff may borrow two books at a time. They shall not keep a book for more than a fortnight.
14. A fine of Re.1/- per day will be levied on the book if detained beyond a fortnight.
15. Books are to be used with maximum care and there should be no damage or disfigurement. Writing with pen or pencil anywhere in the book is strictly prohibited. If found it will be charged.

PARENT – TEACHER ASSOCIATION

There is an effective Parent Teacher Association in the college. It promotes activities for the well-being of the students. The PTA has regular contact with the institution and helps to augment infrastructure and learning resources.

The department provides facilities for various games such as football, cricket, kabadi, shuttle badminton, volley ball

etc. Talented sportsmen will be given proper coaching and incentives.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME

The students' participation in community service is ensured through the National Service Scheme. The college has one unit (No. 253). The membership in NSS is voluntary. The NSS volunteers take up various socially relevant activities, which result in their own personality development as well as the betterment of the community in and around the institution.

COLLEGE UNION

The college union is an elected body of students. The students' involvement in co-curricular activities such as sports, games, arts is ensured through the democratically elected representatives. It is also a forum through which students learn the basics of democratic values. Parliamentary mode will be followed in the students' union election of the college as per the judgment of the Honourable High Court.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE

The students' union brings out an annual magazine. The magazine is meant for promoting the creative and artistic talents of the students in a modest way. The Principal is the final authority in all matters concerning the college

magazine. He has the discretionary power to publish, include or reject matters without assigning any reason.

OLD STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION

Old students' Association of the college in the name of FOPCA (Foundation of PEEKAY CICS Arts And Science College Alumni's) was formed in 2019. The association is on the forefront of initiating generous measures to the needy students and officials of the college.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND SUPPORTING WINGS

ANTI-RAGGING COMMITTEE

The anti-ragging committee is headed by the head of the institution and it consists of representatives of faculty members, parents, students belonging to the fresher's category as well as senior students and non-teaching staff. It will consider the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging squad to take appropriate decisions, including spelling out suitable punishments to those found guilty.

ANTI-RAGGING SQUAD

The Anti-ragging squad is nominated by the head of the institution. It consists of members belonging to the various sectors of the campus community. The squad will keep vigil, and patrol in the campus area. It keeps mobile, alert and active at all times and will be empowered to inspect places

of potential ragging and make surprise raids. The squad will investigate incidents of ragging and make recommendations to the Anti-Ragging committee.

WOMEN`S CELL

The cell is constituted as per the directions of the University Grants Commission. It looks into the grievances of girl students and women members of the staff of the college and takes concrete measures.

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell is a body proposed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC). The IQAC is functioning under the guidance of the Principal with external experts and members from the teaching and administrative staff. It assesses the performance of each unit of the college and suggests corrective measures.

ACADEMIC MONITORING COMMITTEE

Academic Monitoring Committee is constituted to monitor and ensure the academic performance of the students on a continuous basis. Assessment of each student will be the responsibility of the tutor concerned, and it will be further reviewed twice in a semester by Academic Monitoring Committee. Based on a thorough analysis, all support and measures will be implemented for the improvement in academics.

STUDENTS' WELFARE THE ADVISORY SCHEME

The students of the college are divided at the beginning of the year into groups depending on the strength of the class. Each group is placed under the personal care of a teacher designated Advisor. The groups will meet formally at regular intervals. They will also meet informally in small groups as often as possible. The Advisors will discuss with the group under their care, and take remedial measures if necessary. The advisors will exercise strict disciplinary control over their wards. They will closely watch their conduct and progress and maintain continuous contact with the parents as well as the wards.
